Class Descriptions

10/7/22 AM: Masters: Lines & Landings- Affecting the Dogs Landing, to Maximize Course Flow: If a dog lands a jump headed towards the next obstacle they are more likely to stay on a smooth course, and avoid off-courses, AND a big bonus! Many dogs speed up because of gaining confidence, knowing where they are going sooner! Barb will work with participants to smooth out their crosses to help achieve accurate landing direction, as well as how to use their running path to set lines to achieve this same goal.

10/7/22 PM: Blind Crosses- Barb started using blind crosses in 2006 and eventually developed foundation training for her students. She released the DVD in 2011, "Adding Blind Crosses to Your Handling System ". Students will experience this foundation training and will work on timing and implementation. They will also learn about what makes it work and what happens to make it go wrong. Because of this understanding the blind cross can become a successful way for students to get up the field quicker and to make sure they are never in their dog's way. Then the students will use it in longer sequences and be aided on how to make the decision whether to use a blind cross or front cross or rear cross.

10/8/22 AM: Young Dogs (5 months and up)- Participants will do short sequences of jumps and tunnels. Topics will include how to build fundamental cues, such as out, go-on, and turn-away. Also, building handler awareness of line-setting, ideas on how to keep their young dogs motivated and interested. Jump bars will be on the ground or low, depending on the dog's age and experience.

10/8/22 PM: Novice/Intermediate- Participants will work on ideas for keeping their dog's motivated and happy. Attention will be given to smoothing out the handler's crosses and keeping connection with the dog while performing them. Techniques of crosses will be discussed and practiced. Handling obstacle discrimination will also be discussed and practiced. Dogs should be familiar with all agility obstacles, but not necessarily proficient.

10/9/22 AM: Building Distance to Backsides & Various Skills for Backside Moves- After learning backsides, build

distance to this skill and learn to set your dog up for the next obstacle in the sequence.
