Lauren Zimmerman is a competitive dog agility handler and coach that currently shares her home with 5 wonderful dogs: Clutch, Dublin, Denali, Savage & Maestro. She is a Certified Canine Athlete Specialist (CCAS) and is most known for her association and training with Susan Garrett's Handling 360 program. Due to this, most of her current handling expertise is verbal based, but she has also worked with multiple OMD coaches as well - which gives her a firm understanding of body positioning and motion cues in addition to her verbal proficiency. She only uses positive reinforcement when training all of her dogs to become canine athletes, as she feels it is especially critical during agility training. She has a strong understanding of course design and reading natural cues/lines of agility dogs due to her ongoing studies with multiple European agility handlers.

Since starting to compete, she has won several regional championships including the 'triple crown' at the Canadian USDAA regional in 2017. She has made, ran and placed in the top 10 at several National championships in USDAA and UKI, including the USDAA Grand Prix Finals & winning the UKI National Speedstakes Championships in 2018.

Seminar Topics & Descriptions

DAY ONE May 7, 2022

Dust & Stars (8:30am-12:30pm)

Teams currently competing at the Excellent/Masters level who are aspiring to reach higher heights, such as International competition, or wanting to be competitive at a National level here in the USA. Teams will work through an international agility inspired course that encompasses many challenges including threadles, backsides, layering, obstacle discrimination, & independent obstacle commitment. The course design will always have a European feel/focus, with lots of open lines and room to run!

This course is also available in a Jumping course only forum.

If a team is wanting to expand on coursework challenges, obstacle independence, & speed - this is the one for them! Knowledge & general proficiency on ALL obstacles is required.

Brick & Mortar (2pm-6pm)

Teams currently working/competing at the Open/Masters level will focus on the dog's understanding of independent skills to grow their collective teamwork for the future.

This workshop is appropriate for those teams with small holes in their foundation understanding that they need help fixing in order to progress forward to higher levels. Our focus will be to improve your handling in addition to addressing skills that need more proofing for overall consistency.

Fundamental knowledge of backsides and threadles is needed for this course.

Dogs must have knowledge of jumps, tunnels, & weave poles that may be used during this workshop.

Seminar Topics & Descriptions

DAY TWO May 8, 2022

Metal & Fire (8:30am-12:30pm)

Teams currently working in the Masters level that are wanting to grow their proficiency for fluidity during coursework & competition. If you are struggling to qualify regularly, looking to decrease your run times, or add more clarity to your training - this is the workshop for you! Understanding lead changes, handling side switches, driving lines, collected turns, setting appropriate lines ahead of the dog, crossing in a timely fashion, & looking to the correct reference points will all help grow your understanding of competing in dog agility with clarity & confidence. Take your team to the next level by adding consistency to your training/handling for implementing at your next competition.

Knowledge and general proficiency on ALL obstacles is required

Grass & Straw (2pm-6pm)

This workshop is for teams with young dogs (over 12 months) or dogs who are newer to the sport, that are just starting out with competition. These teams are working towards putting together full sequences and building their relationship as a team.

Teams may already be competing at the Beginner/Novice level, but need help continuing to grow their current skills to be successful in higher levels of the sport.

Teams will cover how to properly set/drive lines, how to stay connected, how to build commitment to jumps and tunnels, & start true directional/ independent verbal training if they have not already done so.

The primary focus will be to set these teams up for a future of success in the sport by combining proper handling skills & independent obstacle skills.

Knowledge of jumps & tunnels is required to enter this workshop.

Seminar Topics & Descriptions

DAY THREE May 9, 2022

Atoms & Molecules (8:30am-12:30pm)

Got pup? This workshop is all about the 'up and coming' agility teams!

This workshop will cover age-appropriate fundamental training games that are motivational, incredibly useful, and SO MUCH FUN! Teams will work through some of the newest & innovative exercises to get their puppies on the right track for success.

This workshop is age appropriate for puppies 3 to 12 months old, whom are working towards becoming adult canine athletes.

No previous knowledge in dog agility or specific skills are required to enter this workshop.

Rocks & Salt (2pm-6pm)

This workshop is the next step on your journey to becoming a real, competitive dog agility team! Before reaching the beginner/novice competition level, learn how to teach independent obstacles, verbal discriminations, and start to put together small sequences. We will highlight how to start collected turns, build up power in extension lines, & understand lead changes in accordance to the dog's line.

Young dogs should be over 8 months in age and should have previously attended a 'Atoms & Molecules' workshop before proceeding to this next level.

Knowledge of jumps & tunnels is required to enter this workshop.
